Dual Vocational Training

If you have successfully completed a vocational training programme, it is easier to find a good job. The dual vocational training can be an alternative to studying at the university. There are over 300 occupations – from mechatronics technician to dental technician.

The dual vocational training takes between two and three-and-a-half years, depending on the occupation and the degree. "Dual" stands for studying at two locations: At the company, you learn practical skills; at the vocational school, you get the necessary theoretical background.

Advantages of a dual vocational training programme

- On-the-job training
- Combine theory and practice
- Study and earn money
- Make new social contacts at the company
- Become a skilled worker

Apply at the company

You have decided on an occupation and found a company? Then apply directly at the company for a trainee position. A school leaving certificate is not always necessary. The company decides which qualifications they require. There is no age limit. You can also start a vocational training programme when you are 30 and older. An internship can prepare you for a vocational training. It can also help you to get to know a company and an occupation and to improve your German.

Requirements for starting a vocational training programme

- Knowledge of German, typically at level B2
- School leaving certificates, depending on the occupation
- Residence status with permit to work
